WHERE THE RIVER BENDS

At the west end of Montgomery Street, Riverbend Park features a stunning arched gateway that invites visitors to the scenic Feather River. Are you an outdoor enthusiast? There's something for everyone — a full disc golf course, boat, kayak & canoe launches, dog park, picnic, fishing and swimming areas, trails and a bike & skate park at nearby Bedrock Park.

HISTORIC DOWNTOWN

The drive into the historic downtown takes you along shady streets lined with lovely Victorian homes. In the heart of the historic district you'll find a variety of unique boutiques and dining opportunities. If you're looking for a walk about town, try the walking path along the river, the Museum Walking Tour or the Heritage Mural Walk which showcases local history.

GREENLINE BRIDGE

This destination offers something special on each side of the river. The historic Nature Center location is home to the seasonal celebration of the return of the salmon and offers a habitat for native plants. The Fish Hatchery showcases the salmon's journey up the fish ladders with close-up viewing windows and informative displays. Biking enthusiasts will find access to 110 miles of bike trails. A stroll on the green bridge gives you a bird's eye view of the river.



THE LAKE

Walk across the tallest earthen-filled dam in the U.S. or climb a 47 foot tower to view the lake, surrounding mountains and valley. There's easy access to equestrian trails, a horse camp, Bidwell Marina and the Bidwell Bar Bridge. Over 40 square miles of water and 167 miles of shoreline provide opportunity for boating, fishing, skiing and camping.

BEYOND THE GREENLINE

FEATHER FALLS

Hike to Feather Falls! At 640 feet it's the sixth tallest waterfall in the continental United States.



TABLE MOUNTAIN & CHEROKEE

In spring take in the wildflower bloom or explore the gold mining town of Cherokee which once boasted 17 saloons, 8 hotels, 2 churches and its own brewery!

LAKE OROVILLE

Lake Oroville beckons with 167 miles of shoreline and its wide offering of water recreation including fishing, swimming, and house boating, along with boat-in and floating campsites.

RICH AGRICULTURAL HERITAGE

The olive industry had its roots in Oroville, and today there are working olive ranches on many hillsides. Mandarin ranches, orange orchards and several boutique wineries dot the area.

BALD ROCK

A short hike takes you to the moon-like unique rock formations of Bald Rock and spectacular views of mountain ranges and the Sacramento Valley.



OROVILLE STATE WILDLIFE AREA

Not every community has 10,000 acres of preserved natural beauty right outside its city limits. The preserve is home to 35 species of mammals & 178 species of birds.

THERMALITO FOREBAY, AFTERBAY & AQUATIC CENTER

Looking for a place to picnic, swim or bird watch? You will find a variety of water activities for all ages at the Forebay & Aquatic Center.

FEATHER RIVER CANYON NATIONAL SCENIC BYWAY

From river's edge to soaring heights, this 130 mile Scenic Byway offers unforgettable views of the spectacular Feather River Canyon.

THERE'S MORE TO EXPLORE IN OROVILLE

Oroville was settled in 1848 during the first wave of California's Gold Rush. From a rough mining camp, it quickly grew into a viable town, and served as a supply depot for gold miners working claims in the Feather River canyons. Today, Oroville is best known for its



premier water recreation.


What better way to explore Oroville's rich heritage and beautiful surrounding countryside than by following the Greenline Tour? The tour
